

16-19 Bursary Fund Application Guidance (2025-2026)

Introduction

The 16-19 Bursary is awarded to eligible students to provide support towards the cost of transport and other course-related costs. The payment of the Bursary award is subject to DfE guidance and Durham Sixth Form Centre's Bursary Policy which can be accessed via:

The guidance below will help you complete the application form and identify which Bursary you may be eligible to apply for. Bursary payments are only made if students' attendance and behaviour meet the required standard and they remain at Durham Sixth Form Centre. **If your attendance falls below 90% your payment may be reduced.**

Eligibility Criteria

- Aged 16–18 on 31 August 2025.
- Aged 19+ only if continuing a course started aged 16–18 or with an EHCP.
- Students aged 16 or under are only eligible to receive a discretionary bursary in exceptional circumstances; where a student is following an accelerated study programme.
- UK resident or with legal right to reside in the UK.

Types of 16–19 Bursaries

A. Vulnerable Student Bursary	
Students in specific vulnerable groups may receive up to £1,200 per year, based on need.	
Evidence Required	
Written confirmation of current or previous looked –after status from the relevant local authority.	
A copy of the award notice clearly stating the claim is in the student's name.	
A copy of the claim award from DWP & ESA Statement or UC Statement.	















B. Discretionary Bursary

There are 2 types of discretionary bursary: Transport Contribution or Free School Meals (FSM). Students may only apply for one.

Evidence required for Discretionary Bursary

The following list shows examples of the evidence you can provide of total taxable household income. - P60's for the whole household & Child Tax Credit Statement
- 3 months of Wage slips for whole household & Child Tax Credit Statement
- Self Employed Earnings (official tax return) APR24 & Child Tax Credit Statement
- Full Working Tax Credit Award Notice 2024/25

• Zone 4 (7+ miles): £750/year (£250/term)

- 3x monthly Universal Credit Awards showing all allowances and deductions
- Other Benefits / Pension (award Letter) & Child Tax Credit Statement
